#### INTRODUCTION

Bolpur Manab Jamin, a Non-Governmental Organization situated in a dry zone area that has Laterite soil and Vindhya Alluvial soil. The area has mono cropping with rice, which is entirely rain fed. The project area is near Santiniketan; however, the area is underdeveloped and has a large population of landless farmers.

The district of Birbhum lies between 23°23' 30" and 24°35' 0" North Latitudes and between 87°05' 25" and 88°01' 41" East Longitude. The district is bounded on the north and west, by the district of Santhal Pargana of Jharkhand, on the east by the districts of Murshidabad and Burdwan and on the south by Burdwan, from which it is separated by the Ajay River.

BMJ is working at 15 villages of 4 Gram Panchayats (5 villages in Ruppur Gram Panchayat, 7 villages in Raipur-Supur Gram Panchyat, 2 villages in Sattore Gram Panchayat and 1 village in Kankalitala Gram Panchyat) of Bolpur-Sriniketan Block.

#### **Programme Objectives:**

- To improve Food Security
- To increase the Nutritional Status of families
- To reduce school dropout
- Improve financial inclusion
- Involve more people in Income Generation Schemes.
- Increase environmental awareness

#### **HIGHLIGHTS OF THE PAST YEAR'S ACQUISITION PROJECTS**

#### 1. Hand Washing & Sanitation Programme

Bolpur Manab Jamin has been evolved as a result of its experiences of working with communities, its organizational set-up, the skills of its team-members, and its focus on empowerment of communities. Based on these experience, envisages the development of basic health and hygiene in different areas with the support of the community.

According to the Centers for Disease Control, hand washing is considered the single most important means of preventing the spread of infection. Diseases are caused by germs and germs are carried on your hands. Proper hand washing, by children and staff (teaching staff), is an easy and effective way to reduce the transmission of disease & worms. Hand washing works wonder - the result is fewer sick days and limits visits to the doctor.

The challenge is to transform hand washing with soap from a figurative good idea into an automatic behaviour performed in homes, schools and communities. Turning hand washing with soap before eating and after using the toilet into a deep-rooted habit could save more lives than medical intervention, reducing deaths from stomach infections including Hepatitis A & diarrhoea, acute respiratory infections and fecal-oral transmission of diseases.

Mere hand washing with soap would make a significant contribution to meet the Millennium Development Goal of reducing deaths among children by 2015.

Bolpur Manab Jamin set its goal and had implemented this programme with the support of Dr. Monika.Golembiewski, Shining Eyes, Germany in 2 primary schools, 1 Shishu Shiksha Kendra and one ICDS centre.

This year 403 families were aware and had access to hand washing which includes underprivileged SC, ST, OBC and economically weaker section primary students and their parents. Sanitizing kit was distributed to the children and their families to safeguard their health which will sustain better habit of the community.

# 2. Support of International Centre for Agriculture Research in Dry land Areas (ICARDA)

Research partnerships between Bolpur Manab Jamin and International Centre for Agriculture Research in Dry land Areas (ICARDA) have generated significant benefits for dryland farmers cultivating Lentil. Within this India – Morocco Food Legumes Initiative (IMFLI) initiative through South to South cooperation will join their effort and expertise to boost food legumes production.

Increasing food legumes productions by small farmers to strengthen food and nutrition security through adoption of improved technologies and governance within South-South cooperation are the main aims of the programme.

#### The impacts will be:

- a) Increase in Lentil production.
- b) Increase in household income.
- c) Increase in cropping intensity.
- d) Increase in Legumes consumption.

- e) Combat Malnutrition.
- f) Increase soil fertility.

This year Bolpur Manab Jamin with the technical support of Visva Bharati University provided training to the farmers regarding Lentil cultivation before harvesting of paddy. 186 farmers participated in this programme. 900 kg of special Variety certified seeds had been distributed. Each farmer got special variety of Certified Seeds of Lentil (Moitree variety and Subrata variety) to demonstrate this programme. Apart from that, farmers own labour created forty man days per hectare for lentil cultivation in dry zone, rain fed, mono crop area.

#### 3. Rural Knowledge Library

A library is an organized collection of information resources made accessible to a defined community for reference or borrowing. It also creates a constructive and affirmative environment that encourages independence and self-study.

The Rural Knowledge Library with the support of Australian High Commission, New Delhi under Direct Aid Programme for youth development aims to create opportunities for tribal young people to study, connect to others, develop skills and utilize these skills to contribute to their community. It also provides array of opportunities that enable youth to build their competencies.

250 nos. of under privileged, tribal, schedule caste, economically weaker students were issued books from Rural Knowledge Library. They also took reference books from the Library for different kinds of studies.

#### 4. CBWE

#### a. Quality of Life Training for Unorganized Sector Labour

The term Quality of Life is used to evaluate the general well-being of individuals and societies in a wide range of contexts, including the fields of development, healthcare, policies and schemes. Quality of life should not be confused with the concept of standard of living, which is based primarily on income. Instead, standard indicators of the quality of life include not only wealth and employment, but also the built environment, physical and mental health, education, recreation and leisure time, and social belonging. For that reason 3 no of training on Quality of Life were organized for unorganized sector labour with the help of Central Board for Worker's Education Centre, Asansol Regional Office at three villages under Bolpur Manab Jamin project area each of 2 daylong training and 4 daylong training. Assistant Labour Commissioner and Assistant Director Agriculture, Assistant Director

Consumer Affairs and Fair Business Practices spoke on different schemes, programmes and policies for their socio-economic development as well as the morality of their own lives. There were 20 couples (husband & wife) to participate in this training programme. Every participant got a stipend (Rupees 100.00 per head per day) in lieu of wages to participate at the training programme.

## b. Training for Panchayeti Raj Functionaries

Panchayat Raj is a system of governance in which gram panchayats are the basic units of administration. Functionaries of Raipur-Supur Gram Panchayat and Ruppur Gram panchayat have been given 2 days training by Central Board of Worker's Education Centre, Asansol Regional Office at Manab Jamin, campus office. There were 40 participants in this programme. The elected members of Panchayati Raj Institution, members of Gram Unnayan Samity under Ruppur and Raipur-Supur Gram panchayat had participated in this training programme. Assistant Labour Commissioner, , Inspector- BCW and Block Disaster Management Officer spoke on different schemes, programmes and policies for the socio-economic development of the villagers. The roles and responsibilities of the functionaries were also conversed for the smooth running of the Panchayats.

# c. Awareness Programme on Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act

Six awareness programmes on Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act have been organized with the support of Central Board of Worker's Education Centre, Asansol Regional Office. 240 villagers of 10 villages under Manab Jamin Project area participated in this training programme. The key speakers were Assistant Labour Commissioner, Block Disaster Management Officer who gave a clear idea about the act of MGNREGA's programme and its implementation.

# d. Block level Awareness Programme on Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act

Block level awareness training on Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act have been organized with the support of Central Board for Worker's Education, Asansol Regional Office. 100 participants from 72 different villages participated in the programme. The objective of this programme is to expand the idea on MGNREGA among the villagers. The key speakers of this programme are Assistant Labour Commissioner, Inspector-BCW, Block Disaster Management Officer, Assistant Director Agriculture of Bolpur Sriniketan Block, Social Audit Coordinator, MGNREGA Cell of Bolpur Sriniketan Block, Jt. B.D.O, Regional Director of Central Board for Worker's Education, S.D.O of Bolpur Sub-Division, all spoke on Act and schemes for fruitful implementation of MGNREGA.

#### 5. National Child Labour Programme School

There is an old saying that goes 'The child is the father of the man' it simply implies that childhood is the formative period when a man's character is shaped. Unfortunately children of some segment remain rather neglected and deprived lot in a fast and adult centric world which views everything from its own misconceived perception. What is worse is that in the under developed countries children are not just neglected but actively exploited as a means of cheap labour.

This year, Bolpur Manab Jamin had got sanction to run two NCLP Special School at Labpur and Hansra (Illambazar) from the Project Director, National Child Labour Programme of Birbhum. The objective of this programme is to combat child labour as well as to rehabilitate them in different trade which would make his/her world a shade better.

The children at the age group of 9 to 14 years especially child labour working in brick field or as a maid servant or working in a tea stall are the pupil of this special school. The capacity of the student of each school is 50. Each student gets regular mid-day meal and is allotted with a stipend of Rs.150 per month. The student would also acquire lesson on vocational training along with the regular course of study.

Finally it could be said that child labour is a crime against humanity, and simply goes against nature and least we could do as individuals when we come across a child in harness of any kind is to be considerate to him/her as we would be to our own young ones.

#### 6. Legal Aid Programme

Bolpur Manab Jamin started this programme with the help of Sub Divisional Legal Service Committee, Bolpur Sub Division and First Track Sub Divisional Judge of Bolpur Court. Legal Aid Clinics are intended to provide legal relief easily accessible to the indigent and backward sections of our society. They are almost on the lines of primary health centres where a doctor and other auxiliary medical staff provide basic health care to the people situated in village areas affected with poverty and social squalor. Like the doctors rendering health services to the people of the locality in the primary health centre, a lawyer manning the legal aid clinic provides legal services to the people. The thrust is on the basic legal services like legal advice and assisting in drafting of notices, replies, applications, petitions etc. The legal aid clinic will also attempt to resolve the disputes of the people in the locality, preventing the disputes from maturing into litigation. This provides the lawyer in the legal aid clinic an opportunity to understand the difficulties faced by people in the distant villages' for access to justice. Legal aid clinics have to be manned by para-legal volunteers selected by the Legal Services

Authorities and lawyers with a sense of commitment, sensibility and sensitiveness to the problems of common people.

Our four Para-Legal Volunteers were selected and trained by the Legal Services Authorities who were then deputed to work in the Legal Aid Clinics for assisting the lawyer and the seekers of legal aid. They draft petitions, applications and accompany the seekers of legal aid to the government offices for interacting with the officials for solving the problems of such seekers of legal aid.

#### 8. Linkage Programme

#### **BGREI**

The Government of India has launched a special programme of 'Bringing Green Revolution in Eastern India (BGREI)' - a sub scheme of Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY) from 2010-11 in the eastern states with an objective to increase the productivity of rice based cropping system. This scheme has resulted in impressive increase in production of food grains with the eastern region now turning a food surplus region.

This year 12465 kg of seeds (variety 1010) among 626 nos. of farmers of 11 villages and covered 1887.9 hectare of land under BGREI programme. This programme was supported by Assistant Director of Agriculture, Bolpur-Sriniketan Block. The farmers got two trainings for this programme. The farmers also got financial assistance from the Office of the Assistant Director of Agriculture.

#### 9. BOCCOW

Bolpur Manab Jamin has been involved for the development of unorganized sector labour through the scheme of West Bengal Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare.

The building and other construction workers in the age group of 18 to 55 years and have worked for not less than ninety days in the subsequent one year are eligible for registration as a beneficiary under this scheme. Tri-monthly contributions of Rs.60/- (monthly Rs.20/-) is to be deposited along with relevant documents against which a receipt will be issued by the office and an equal amount has been released by the Government as Matching Contribution.

During 2012, 257 villagers under 23 villages benefited by the scheme of WBBOCWW. Required identity cards of the registered beneficiaries under WBBOCWW have been distributed through and 10 awareness programmes were held at respective villages and campus office of Bolpur Bolpur Manab Jamin.

Under the scheme of WBBOCWW, this year 26 beneficiary got the support of Rs.2000/-for purchasing tools 18 beneficiaries got assistance of Rs. 3000/- for purchasing bicycle and 5

beneficiaries got assistance of Rs. 4000/- each for education for their children for further studies of Higher Secondary. This year one beneficiary got assistance of Rs. 30000/- for death benefit.

#### 10. SASPFUW

Bolpur Manab Jamin has also facilitated 218 beneficiaries under social assistance schemes for the benefit of unorganized sector labour with the help of labour department, Govt. of West Bengal. The name of the Scheme is state Assistant Scheme (SASPFUW) for provision of future.

The subscribers who are involved in the self employment occupation and work at unorganized industries may get the benefit from these schemes.

#### 11. Transport worker

For the benefit of unorganized workers engaged in automobiles Bolpur Manab Jamin implemented the scheme of **West Bengal Transport Workers Social Security Scheme** through West Bengal State Social Security Board, Labour Department, Govt. of West Bengal. The scheme shall apply to all unorganized workers engaged in automobiles used for commercial purposes namely cars, taxies, luxury taxies, light commercial vehicles, vans, auto-rickshaws, tempos, lorries, trucks, bus, etc or by whatever name called, other than those solely owned by an individual for his personal or family use. This year 11 beneficiaries got the benefit of the scheme.

#### 12. CA&FBP Consumer Protection Right

As a general consumer, people always are deprived in daily life to purchase consumable goods. Most of the people have neither any idea regarding the protection of the consumer from deprivation. During this year, Manab Jamin had organized 24 awareness meetings on Consumer Protection Rights at 12 villages under Bolpur Sub Division. Bolpur Manab Jamin had organized this programme to create awareness among the people regarding Consumer Protection Act. This programme have been organized in collaboration with the Dept. of Consumer Affairs & Fair Business Practices, Govt. of West Bengal.

During this year, we also organized the awareness programme on consumer rights & its protection among the School & University student under Manab Jamin project area. Three numbers of awareness programme had been organized among the student of Kankutia Santidev Ghosh High School

#### **Consumer Awareness in Pous Mela**

Pous Mela is an annual fair and festival that takes place in Santiniketan. The fair is held for four days. This year, Bolpur Manab Jamin had organized a Stall at Pous Mela for 4 days from 23<sup>rd</sup> December to 26<sup>th</sup> December in collaboration with Consumer Affairs and Fair Business Practice, Birbhum Regional Office, Suri, Birbhum to create awareness among the consumer's on their rights. The Stall had been inaugurated by Mr. Piyush Mukhopadhyay, Ex principal of Siksha Satra; Prof. Gopal Chandra De, Principal, Palli Siksha Bhavana, Visva Bharati University and Mr. Biswanath Bag, Assistant Director, CA&FBP were present during the time of inauguration. There has been display of various cartoons related to consumer rights and exhibit of a documentary film of the said department. Manab Jamin throughout this fair had aimed to create awareness about the rights guaranteed to consumers under the law and to serve as Guidance Agency to guide consumers to assert such rights.

## 13. Self Help Group: Approaching Towards Sustainability

One of Bolpur Manab Jamin strategic objectives is to contribute to the goal of reducing rural poverty and to provide improved financial and related non-financial services in rural areas.

From the development experience of many countries, it was found that there is correlation between women empowerment through education, poverty entitlement, capital formation, human resource development and formation of self help groups.

At present total number of SHG under Bolpur Manab Jamin are 79 where 914 villagers are involved in these different SHG groups. The majority of the members belong to Scheduled Caste community and the number is 436.

# 14. Farmers Club: Sustaining Growth In Agriculture

National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) encourages banks to promote Farmers' Clubs in rural areas under the Farmers' Club Programme, earlier known as "Vikas Volunteer Vahini (VVV) Programme". The Programme was launched by NABARD in November 1982.

Bolpur Manab Jamin nurtures 16 Farmers' Clubs in 16 villages within the project area with the support of NABARD.

#### 15. Eco Group

Ecological movement has been started under Bolpur Manab Jamin. Eco groups are working actively at villages under Bolpur Manab Jamin project area. The idea to promote Eco Group is to create awareness against environment pollution and to grow habit for tree plantation to protect the environment. The members of Eco group are in the age group of 12 to 18 years and student from class VI to XII, the most of the eco-group members belong to farmers & day laborer family. There are total 307 nos. of eco group members where 128 boys and 179 girls are energetically working.

#### 16. Education Support Programme: For Immaculate Tomorrow

This is a need based programme under which textbooks are given to meritorious and economically weaker students. This year 159 students studying from Class VI to Bachelors Degree got the support.

Among them 67 numbers of boys and 92 numbers of girls received the books. The caste wise distribution was 70 numbers of Scheduled Caste, 13 numbers of Scheduled Tribe and 47 numbers of others.

#### 17. Kala Azar

Kala Azar has been a major public health concerns in West Bengal. This disease is mostly prevalent in hard core endemic pockets inhabited predominantly by poor rural populations including the Scheduled Tribes, Scheduled Castes, and other marginalized communities, who have relatively limited access to quality health care, communication and other basic facilities, and are thus rather vulnerable.

Bolpur Manab Jamin and West Bengal Voluntary Health Association partnership is a key supportive programme strategy aiming at reaching the entire target population with correct information and services on effective Vector Borne Disease control/elimination tools and technologies at Birbhum. In this background, the present project is providing effective and high quality technical and management services to plan and implement social mobilization and delivery of timely and appropriate preventive and curative service for Kala-azar elimination in identified endemic areas.

Bolpur Manab Jamin members carry out active search of fever cases and ensure timely and appropriate diagnosis and treatment with the help of related Health Departments.

#### 18. Health Awareness: Commit To Be Fit

This is the programme for the women. The inspiration of this programme is to create awareness among the women on health, hygiene, sanitation, family planning, immunization, nutrition, etc. A qualified Doctor have been conducted this awareness programme. During this year, 4 no of health awareness meeting had been organized at four different villages under Bolpur Manab Jamin Project area where 116 women have attended.

The Health In-charge conducted 20 nos. of health awareness meetings at twelve different villages under Bolpur Manab Jamin project area, where 256 women have participated. There have been discussions on how to combat population explosion, immunization, child health care, combat malnutrition, improvement of health and hygiene, etc.

#### 19. Nutritional Garden

Growing of organic vegetables in the Kitchen Garden is a very popular programme for the housewives. The vegetables are grown in their homestead land three times a year. Seeds were supplied to them in each season. Normally they got seed in three seasons. They have used only

organic manures for production of vegetables. They have been taught on the use of Liquid Manure and use of organic pesticides for control of insect, pests and diseases.

The production of vegetables enriched their diet due to consumption of part of it in their daily meals. In some cases they have also earned pocket money by selling a part of the vegetables produced by them.

This is one of the popular programme of Bolpur Manab Jamin where the women of had demonstrated this programme. The main thrust of this programme is to propagate the home stead kitchen garden which would be source of nutritional supply of the family as well as secondary source of earning the pocket money. Bolpur Manab Jamin supplied seed and seedling in three times in a year that is in rainy season, winter season and summer season. The women have used only organic manure and homemade organic pesticides. During this year, 200 women have demonstrated the kitchen garden programme. The production of vegetable has enriched their diet. In some cases they have earn some money by selling a part of the produce.

#### 20. Promotion Of Medicinal Garden (Health Garden)

The idea of this programme is to promote the health garden within the homestead area and women have taken the responsibility to look after the medicinal garden. The women have got the technical know-how on: use of medicinal plants for prevention of primary illness. During this year 7 types of medicinal plants had been distributed among 83 women under Bolpur Manab Jamin project area. The women have used it for prevention of primary illness like acidity, stomach problem, cough & cold etc.

#### 21. Mushroom Cultivation

Mushroom cultivation's economic importance lies primarily in its use as food for human consumption. It is one of the programmes of Bolpur Manab Jamin. Oyster mushroom is grown at moderate temperature ranging from  $20^{\circ}$  C to  $30^{\circ}$  C and humidity 55-70% for a period of 2 to 4 months in the project villages.

This year spawn was distributed among 47 numbers of women farmers from 4 villages and 104 no of demonstration have been made. Most of them are landless and SHG members.

#### 22. Maize & Black Gram Cultivation

The story of maize/corn began in 1492 when Columbus's men discovered this new grain in Cuba. Maize, a high yielding cereal crop, is a member of the grass family Gramineae. Bolpur Manab Jamin teaches, if it is cultivated with proper care and management, it will be able to meet the need of food in a considerable extent of ever increasing population.

In America it is considered as the king of field crops. It is used as staple food in Mexico, Brazil, Nigeria, Kenya etc.

Urd or black gram is a native of India and originated from Phaseolus sublobatus, a wild plant. It is very rich in protein containing about 25 per cent protein in its seed and is the richest in phosphoric acid among pulses.

Urd bean being leguminous has the capacity to fix atmospheric nitrogen and thus helps in restoring the soil fertility.

During this year, Dryland Research Station, Bankura came forward to help Manab Jamin to distribute 30 kg of Maize and 20 kg of Black Gram to 10 farmers in the village of Mirzapur. The farmers cultivated 7.75 bighas of land with this support.

#### 23. Bolpur Manab Jamin Foundation Day
